



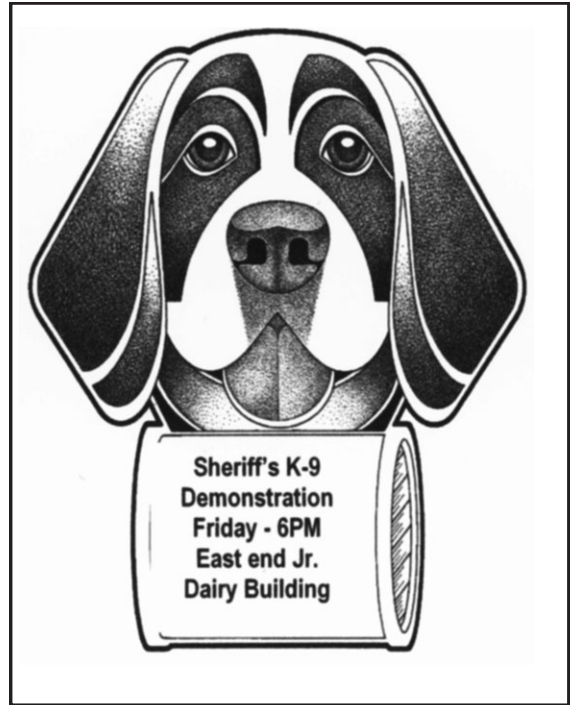

PARK REGULATIONS FOR THE HURON COUNTY FAIR

The west parking lot shall be used for parking livestock exhibitors and personnel of Huron County Fair. Exhibitors must have a West Lot Pass on the vehicle. North of drive exclusive for livestock exhibitors parking. Camping limited to directors, electrician, security and other fair personnel as designated. (South of road to Heritage). All other camping in south lot. Must have membership or season ticket to camp. A waiting list will be maintained to fill openings as they occur.

All livestock exhibitors and others will enter the west gate for feeding.

Livestock feeders and/or concessionaire suppliers will be permitted on grounds until 10:00 A.M. Livestock feeders will be allowed on grounds in the afternoon between 4:00 and 6:00 P.M. There will be no concessionaire suppliers allowed on grounds in vehicles after 10:00 A.M. Parking for concessionaires after hours will be in west parking lot.

There will be NO parking inside the fairgrounds unless authorized. All unauthorized vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

All exhibitor's vehicles and others shall exhibit on windshield of vehicle the proper decal as issued.

South parking lot is for general paid admissions, campers, directors and guests.

All trucks and trailers will park in designated areas in South parking lot.

No one permitted in exhibit buildings after 11:00 P.M.

Curfew is 12:00 midnight and will be strictly enforced.

Vehicle passes will be handled by fair manager and parking committee.

Camper applications available at the Secretary's Office.

All camper and admission fees must be paid at the time of application. Must buy membership or season ticket.

Any infraction of rules and regulations of campers will be deemed reasonable grounds for immediate disbarment. All campsites must have an adult.

South parking lot camping, livestock and all other camping livestock exhibitors preference.

After campers are parked they must remain in place for duration of Fair or space will be forfeited.

When set, the camper shall have a minimum of 15 feet between it and the respective lot lines.

All garbage and refuse shall be stored in suitable containers and deposited daily in dumpster provided and located by the Fair Board.

Individual campers shall be responsible for policing their campsites daily.

All liquid waste from trailer-camper units shall be collected in enclosed containers such as "tote tank", 5-15 gallon sizing. When filled, this grey water (sink waste) shall be disposed of in a slop drain designated by the Fair Board.

Toilet waste shall not be drained from any waste line or holding tank. (Units equipped with holding tanks may use them, but the holding tanks are not to be emptied at the fairgrounds).

All electrical connections to be grounded.

Campers may be placed on lots the Thursday prior to fair week.

Campers must be removed by Tuesday evening following the last day of the fair.

Electric and water will be turned on Saturday morning before the fair.
